For the past 25 years, we have been collecting shoeboxes filled with gifts and delivering them to children in need around the world. Each box is an opportunity for a boy or girl to experience the love of God in a tangible way and hear the Gospel.

In Moldova, Marina has a hard life. Her mother passed away and her father is paralyzed. As a young teen, she lived alone with her blind and bedridden grandmother. In addition to her schoolwork, Maria cut wood, collected water, and prepared food for her grandmother until she also died. But great joy came into Marina's life when she received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift. She loved the hat and gloves she found inside and the note that said, "Jesus loves you." Soon after, a friend invited her to church where she accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior. Now despite her difficulties, Marina says that knowing God makes her happy.

Many boys and girls who receive shoebox gifts also enroll in our follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey, where they learn to follow Christ and share Him with others. It all starts with a simple gift. Will you prayerfully consider joining us in this exciting ministry?

Also, on the 21st, we painted pumpkins and made s'mores by the fire at the picnic shelter. It was a beautiful fall afternoon, and we had a wonderful time. We even went for a nature walk with Mr. Mike, Miss Valerie, and Miss Laura. Mr. Mike even showed us where we could find a beaver dam.

Ready to Worship Series Prepares Our Young Children

This fall during our annual Ready to Worship series, five students had the opportunity to learn together about various aspects of our worship. This study is designed to prepare children for the transition from Children's Church to attending and engaging in the full worship service. We talked about why we worship, different types of prayer, how to read hymns, how to look up scripture, memorizing the Lord's Prayer, the sacraments and lots more. They were a great class and picked up things very quickly.

During our time together, they also built their worship "tool kits" and placed them in a binder. The zippered pouch includes highlighters for marking their bulletins, several bookmarks, and a ring of cards which include frequently used responses. Following the zipper pouch is a worship guide. This guide goes through the regular order of service, and reminds the children what each part is about, and how they can participate in it. Next, there is a "for practice" section, which will give the children something constructive to do if their mind is wandering during the sermon. The last section in the notebook is a Glossary of worship words, which may help parents answer a question their child raises, or may give them a place to look if they want to know more about something in the service. Please hope these tool kits will be helpful as the children begin to participate fully in the service.


